The AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015 will serve as a qualifying event for the Rio 2016 Olympic Games. Additional information will be available in the Rio 2016 qualification system document.

Boxer Eligibility

Age Requirements:

All boxers participating in the AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015 must be born between 1 January 1, 1975 and December 31, 1996. In addition, the boxers born until December 31, 1997 are also allowed to participate.

Medical Requirements:

To be eligible to participate in the AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015, all boxers must satisfy the medical requirements according to the AIBA Technical Rules and AOB Competition Rules (www.aiba.org/default.aspx?pld=183#).

Additional IF Requirements:

To be eligible to participate in the AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015, all boxers except those under a wild card must:

- Have competed in at least one (1) of the continental qualifying events
- Satisfy the nationality and eligibility requirements according to the AOB Competition Rules.

Qualification Pathway

For each qualifying event, the qualification places obtained for the AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015 will be allocated to the boxers according to below table which shows the overall distribution of all quotas by continent:

OCBC Oceania Confederation Boxing Championships 2015

Host Country Places

A maximum of eight (8) quota places across all weight categories, except for the Men's Heavy (91kg) and Super Heavy (+91kg) weight categories will be reserved for the Host Country, with a maximum of one (1) quota place per weight category. The host country quota is included in the Asian quota for the AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015. This means that a maximum of seven (7) boxers from Asia, including the host country, will participate at the Championships.

The Host Country must confirm the use of the Host Country places prior to the ASBC Asian Confederation Boxing Qualifying Events. The chosen boxers will also be able to qualify through the ASBC Asian Confederation Boxing Championships 2015.

Wild Card Places

A maximum of six (6) quota places will be retained by AIBA as wild card places. The wild card places will be allocated at AIBA's discretion ensuring a high level of competition within the following categories:

Confirmation Process for Quota

Following the qualifying events, AIBA will officially inform the respective National Federations of the names of the boxers who have gained qualification places. The National Federations will have to send a confirmation to AIBA that these boxers will participate in the AIBA World Boxing Championships Doha 2015 within two weeks.

Reallocation of Unused Quota Places

Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places:

If an allocated quota place from any Continental Qualifying Event is not confirmed or is declined by a National Federation within the deadline, the unused quota place will be reallocated to the next best ranked boxer, not yet qualified, in the same weight category, this from each respective Continental Qualifying Event.

Reallocation of Unused Host Country Places:

At the end of all Continental Qualifying Events, unused Host Country Place(s) will be returned to the ASBC Asian Confederation Boxing Championships qualifying quota in weight categories not chosen by the Host Country.
